## Take a Stroll Through Historic Rivertown in Kenner

Grab a bike or tie on a pair comfortable walking shoes and head to historic Rivertown in Kenner for relaxing day of history, space travel, art, and theater. Stop at La Salle's Landing for a look at the cypress cross French explorer Robert de La Salle erected when he landed here in 1682 and proclaimed this land to belong to King Louis XIV. Kenner's Heritage Park is full of replicated buildings of yesteryear like a 1930's-era gas station, an icehouse, and a blacksmith shop.



Plan to be in town during a performance at the Rivertown Theaters for the Performing Arts for a night of entertainment, or learn about our universe at a mesmerizing and immersive film screening at the Kenner Planetarium & MegaDome Cinema.

Restore the calories burned on the court at the Coconut Beach Bar & Grill, where they serve mouthwatering options like beignet fries, fried shrimp tacos, burgers, tenders, and wraps, alongside beer, wine, and beach cocktails. ## **Try New Ethnic Foods**
